Step inside to find a thoughtfully laid-out galley featuring a shoreline oven and hob, microwave, toaster, stainless steel sink, and a swan hatch that lets in natural light and fresh canal air. Overhead 12-volt lighting and neatly arranged storage cupboards ensure the space remains functional and well-organised. Adjacent to the kitchen, the saloon is designed for comfort, with a plush sofa bed that doubles as a guest bed, a traditional solid-fuel stove adding warmth and character, built-in storage, and modern touch-sensitive 12-volt lighting that brings a soft glow to the space.

The bedroom is compact yet cleverly designed, offering a storage bed, a shelving unit, and storage steps for practicality. Soft ambient lighting is provided by a combination of 12-volt lights and wall-mounted rechargeable lamps, creating a peaceful and relaxing environment ideal for winding down at the end of the day. The bathroom is neatly appointed with a shower, cassette toilet, sink, full-length mirror, and built-in storage, offering all the essentials for comfortable onboard living.
